Policy

Title:Hired Use of Parks and Reserves –
Charging of Entry Fees by HirerCategoryRecreation, Parks, Bushland and Reserves

Date Last Adopted 7 March 2016

1. Objectives

To provide clear guidelines to Council officers whereby persons granted the use of an area of a park, recreation area, bush land or reserve by the Council cannot charge entry fees, unless by exception.

2. Background

This Policy was developed as a result of an organisation charging an entry fee to an event on Council land.

3. Policy

That:

- 1. Where a person or organisation is granted the use of a Council park, recreation area, bushland or reserve for an activity or function, the person or organisation is to be informed that the charging of a fee to members of the public to gain access to the area is not permitted without the prior consent of the Council.
- 2. The approval of the charging of a fee may be exercised by the Parks and Recreation Committee in accordance with its general delegated power to affix conditions on the use of reserves for special functions.
- 3. This policy does not apply to Council organised events.
- 4. This policy does not apply to the hirers of Council sports grounds which are fully secured.
