



Community Murals and Street Art

The City of Hobart aims to strike a balance between the reduction of illegal graffiti and promoting legal and socially beneficial creativity that contributes towards a vibrant, inclusive and culturally expressive city.

Graffiti or Street Art?

The City of Hobart makes a clear distinction between illegal graffiti and street art.

Graffiti is defined as writing, painting, drawing, etching, pasting or stencilling on private or public property without the permission of the owner or without all regulatory requirements.

Community murals and street art are defined as writing, painting, drawing, etching, pasting or stencilling on private or public property with the permission of the property owner and where all planning and regulatory requirements have been met.

Murals and Street Art on Private Property

The following provides the recommended process for private property owners or artists considering creating murals or street art on private property.

Step 1: A property owner or artist contacts the Council to discuss potential mural or street art.

Step 2: Property owner or artist progresses mural or street art independently recognising and meeting local planning scheme or other regulatory requirements (no further steps required) or;

Step 3: A property owner or artist requests the Council's involvement with the process.

Step 4: A property owner or artist, and a Council officer assess the proposal.

Step 5: Property owner provides permission to use the surface.

Step 6: For large complex projects the property owner or artist and the Council progress the project considering the following project/site management requirements: Project scope, funding, planning and regulatory requirements, design, community engagement, maintenance and renewal.
