

Dear Lord Mayor,

As Tasmanian Greens' Leader and candidate for Clark, I am responding on behalf of all Clark Greens' candidates to your letter dated 9 April this year. Please accept my apologies for the delayed response.

In addition to the commitments we have made in our response to election priorities put forward by the Mayors of Greater Hobart, including to the Hobart Transit Centre, I can indicate Tasmanian Greens' support for all three priority projects put forward by Hobart City Council.

As you would be aware, the Greens have long opposed the proposed cable car to the summit of *kunanyi* and planned privatization of the Pinnacle. We are the only party in the Tasmanian Parliament to have voted against the removal of the Wellington Park Trust's veto power over development in the Park, and against the enabling legislation which seeks to gift the Pinnacle to a private developer.

We recognise the Hobart City Council has a true vision for the mountain that respects its natural and cultural values, while enhancing sustainable public access.

We certainly want to see improved and safer public access to the Pinnacle and look forward to helping in any way we can to progress Council's planning and works on the 'park, bus, walk, run and ride' project. The Greens can commit \$3.3million towards this work and will include this commitment in our costings to Treasury.

We also recognise the Doone Kennedy Aquatic Centre needs refurbishment and can commit to working with Council to secure funding for this important project.

Thank you for writing to the Tasmanian Greens' candidates in Clark. Thank you also for the work you do as Lord Mayor for a more liveable, accessible, kind and prosperous *nipaluna*/Hobart.
