DOG OWNER INFORMATION

WHY REGISTER?

In accordance with Section 8(1) of the *Dog Control Act 2000* it is a legal requirement for any dog over the age of 6 months to be registered.

COMPULSORY MICROCHIPPING

As well as registering any dog over 6 months of age it is also a legal requirement to ensure your dog is implanted with an approved microchip and this number provided to Council at the time of registration. Failure to register or microchip your dog may result in an infringement notice being issued to you.

KENNEL LICENCE

A kennel licence is required if the owner has three or more dogs on a property. Please contact the Animal Management Unit on 03 62 382 182 for further information or visit hobartcity.com.au to download an information pack.

DOGS AT LARGE (ROAMING) AND IMPOUNDING

If your dog is found at large and is wearing the prescribed Council tag, efforts will be made to return the dog home to you if someone is at the premises. If the dog is not wearing its Council tag it may be impounded at the Hobart Dogs' Home at Risdon Vale. An infringement notice may also be issued to you in addition to fees paid at the Hobart Dogs' Home for 'Dog at Large'. The Hobart Dogs' Home can be contacted on 6243 5177.

CHANGE IN CIRCUMSTANCES

You must notify the General Manager in writing or via email within 14 days of moving to another municipality or any other change to the ownership details of the dog.

DOGS IN PUBLIC PLACES

- A dog must be walked on a lead that's not more than 2 metres long when on a public road or footpath. For off lead and declared areas information visit Council's website: <https://www.hobartcity.com.au/Residents/Pets-and-animals/Dogs/Dog-exercise-areas>
- You are not permitted to walk more than 2 dogs on a lead on a public road or footpath.
- Owners must immediately remove and dispose of any faeces left by the dog.
- Dogs must remain under effective control of the owner or person in charge of the dog at all times. This includes when exercising a dog in an off-lead area.
- Please refer to the Dog Control Act 2000 for further information.

RESTRICTED BREED DOGS

In accordance with Section 29 of the *Dog Control Act 2000*, restricted breeds must be automatically declared as dangerous dogs. Restricted breeds are American Pit Bull Terrier (or Pit Bull Terrier), Fila Brasileiro, Dogo Argentino, Japanese Tosa, Perro de Presa Canario.

PRIVACY STATEMENT
