The City of Hobart is aiming for zero waste to landfill by 2030. Help us get there by using a recycling bank at the Council Centre to recover hard-to-recycle products. Use this flyer to make sure only correct items are disposed of at the unit.

Give your waste a second life



PLASTICS Down-cycled into products like garden pots, park benches and synthetic decking.



E-WASTE AND BATTERIES

Precious metals recovered for remanufacture. Plastics down-cycled into Laserlite roofing, machine casings, lego and car components.



TONER CARTRIDGES

Turned into Modified Toner Polymer (MTP),and mixed with asphalt for road surfacing.

X-RAYS

Silver is recovered for remanufacture and PET plastic is down-cycled into products.



LIGHT GLOBES AND FLUORO TUBES

Mercury is re-used in the manufacture of dental amalgam. Glass is recycled into glass wool for home insulation. Phosphor powder is recycled into fertiliser products.
